*Fees and Duties Act 1989***REPLACEMENT MICARD FEES ORDER 2014<sup>1</sup>**

*Approved by Tynwald:* 19 November 2014  
*Coming into Operation:* 1 December 2014

The Treasury makes the following Order under section 1(1) and (2) of the *Fees and Duties Act 1989*.

**Editorial Note:** This Order made under the Fees and Duties Act 1989 is continued by virtue of section 102 of the Interpretation Act 2015.

**1 Title**

This Order is the Replacement MiCard Fees Order 2014.

**2 Commencement**

If approved by Tynwald, this Order comes into operation on 1 December 2014<sup>1</sup>.

**3 Interpretation**

In this Order “**MiCard**” has the meaning given in regulation 21ZA<sup>2</sup> of the Social Security (Claims and Payments) Regulations 1987<sup>3</sup> (as they have effect in the Island)<sup>4</sup>.

**4 MiCard replacement fee**

- (1) A fee of £10.00 is prescribed for the issue of a MiCard to a person (P) to replace another MiCard issued to P (“P’s old MiCard”) if paragraphs (2) and (3) apply.
- (2) P’s old MiCard has been lost, destroyed or made inoperable through P’s neglect, deliberate act or deliberate failure to act.

- (3) At the date it is replaced, P's old MiCard has not reached its expiry date.
- (4) A fee prescribed by this article is payable by P.
