INTERPRETATION ACT 2015 (SECTION 16) ORDER 2022¹

Approved by Tynwald: 19 January 2023
Coming into Operation in accordance with article 2

The Council of Ministers makes the following Order under section 16(6) of the Interpretation Act 2015.

1 Title

This Order is the Interpretation Act 2015 (Section 16) Order 2022.

2 Commencement

If approved by Tynwald, this Order¹ comes into operation on day after it is made.

3 Amendment of section 16 of the Interpretation Act 2015

In section 16(5) of the Interpretation Act 2015, in the table, for “The Chief Secretary” substitute **“The Chief Executive Officer (Isle of Man Government)”**.

4 Consequential amendments

- (1) The Interpretation Act 2015 is further amended as follows —
- (a) in section 73(1), for “the Chief Secretary” substitute **“the Chief Executive Officer (Isle of Man Government)”**;
 - (b) in section 74(1), for “the Chief Secretary” substitute **“the Chief Executive Officer (Isle of Man Government)”**;
 - (c) in the Schedule, in paragraph 1 —
 - (i) at the appropriate place in the order of definitions insert —
“Chief Executive Officer (Isle of Man Government)” means the person appointed to that post in accordance with the Public Services Commission Act 2015;

- (ii) omit the definition of “Chief Secretary”.
- (2) In section 7(5) of the Public Services Commission Act 2015, for “the Chief Secretary” substitute ~~the~~ the Chief Executive Officer (Isle of Man Government) ~~the~~.

5 Further consequential provision

A reference in any other Manx legislation to the Chief Secretary shall be taken as a reference to the Chief Executive Officer (Isle of Man Government).
