## CASH IN POSTAL PACKETS ACT 2013

*Signed in Tynwald:* 19 February 2013  
*Received Royal Assent:* 19 February 2013  
*Announced to Tynwald:* 20 February 2013

**AN ACT** to amend the Customs and Excise Management Act 1986; the Post Office Act 1993 and the Proceeds of Crime Act 2008 to make provision in relation to cash contained in postal packets; to add definitions in section 15 of the Post Office Act 1993; and for connected purposes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Council and Keys in Tynwald assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

### *Introductory*

#### **1 Short title**

The short title of this Act is the Cash in Postal Packets Act 2013.

#### **2 Commencement**

- (1) This Act, other than section 1 and this section, comes into operation on the day appointed by order of the Treasury.
- (2) The Treasury may by order make transitional and saving provisions which it considers necessary or expedient in connection with the commencement of any provision made by or under this Act.

#### **3 Expiry**

- (1) This Act expires —
  - (a) on the day after its promulgation if all its provisions are in operation on its promulgation; or
  - (b) otherwise, on the day after the last provision is brought into operation.

- (2) But the expiry does not affect the continuing operation of the amendments.

*Amendment of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1986*

#### 4 Amendment of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1986

The *Customs and Excise Management Act 1986* is amended in accordance with sections 5 to 9.

#### 5 Section 76A amended

- (1) Section 76A(1) (interpretation of Part VA) is amended as follows.
- (2) In the definition of “declaration” after “section 76C(1)” insert **66**, 76CA(2) or (3) or 76CB(5) or (6) **62**.
- (3) In the definition of “ “export” and “import” ” after “Island” insert **66** and includes the transportation of cash from or to the Island in postal packets **62**.
- (4) After the definition of “money laundering” insert —  
**66** “postal packet” has the same meaning as in section 58(1) of the *Post Office Act 1993*; **62**.
- (5) After the definition of “property obtained through unlawful conduct” insert —  
**66** “sender”, in relation to any postal packet, means the person whose communication it is; **62**.

#### 6 Section 76B amended

- (1) For section 76B(1) (disclosure of cash) substitute —  
**66** (1) A person who is exporting or importing goods must —  
 (a) disclose to an officer if the goods consist of or include cash with a value in excess of the prescribed amount; and  
 (b) answer questions posed to him or her by an officer in respect of any such cash. **62**.
- (2) For the marginal note to section 76B substitute **66** Persons exporting or importing goods **62**.

#### 7 New sections 76CA to 76CC

After section 76C insert —

**76CA Persons sending and receiving cash in postal packets**

- (1) This section applies where a postal packet contains cash with a value in excess of the prescribed amount.
- (2) Where a postal packet is sent from the Island, the sender must make a declaration to an officer.
- (3) Where a postal packet is sent to the Island, the person to whom the packet is addressed must make a declaration to an officer upon receiving the packet.
- (4) The Treasury must by order prescribe the form and manner in which declarations under subsections (2) and (3) are to be made.

**76CB Cash in postal packets**

- (1) Subsection (2) applies where an officer reasonably suspects that a postal packet contains cash with a value in excess of the prescribed amount.
- (2) The officer may —
  - (a) request that the Isle of Man Post Office detain and open that postal packet; and
  - (b) examine its contents.
- (3) Subsections (4) to (6) apply if —
  - (a) a postal packet examined under subsection (2) contains cash with a value in excess of the prescribed amount; and
  - (b) a declaration has not already been made in respect of that cash in accordance with section 76CA(2) or (3).
- (4) The Isle of Man Post Office may continue to detain the cash but the postal packet and the rest of its contents must be forwarded to the addressee.
- (5) In the case of a packet which is sent to the Island, the person to whom the packet is addressed must make a declaration to an officer.
- (6) In the case of a packet which is sent from the Island, the sender must make a declaration to an officer.
- (7) The Treasury must by order prescribe the form and manner in which declarations under subsections (5) and (6) are to be made.
- (8) Without limiting section 76G, a postal packet that is opened and examined under this section must be resealed with all of its original contents and forwarded by the Isle of Man Post Office to the addressee if —
  - (a) it does not contain cash with a value in excess of the prescribed amount; or

- (b) a declaration has been received by an officer in respect of that packet in accordance with subsection (5) or (6).
- (9) This section does not affect the operation of any other statutory provision.

### 76CC Sections 76CA and 76CB supplementary

An order under section 76CA(4) or 76CB(7) may make detailed provision in respect of any matter that the Treasury considers is necessary or expedient to give further effect to those sections. **22**.

## 8 Section 76H amended

- (1) Section 76H (notice of seizure of cash) is amended as follows.
- (2) At the beginning of subsection (2) insert **23** Subject to subsection (2A), **22**.
- (3) After subsection (2) insert —
  - 23** (2A) In the case of cash contained in a postal packet, notice must be given to —
    - (a) the sender (if known); and
    - (b) the addressee. **22**.

## 9 New section 76I

After section 76H add —

### **23** 76I No excuse from complying with a requirement under Part VA

- (1) A person is not excused from complying with a requirement under this Part on the ground that —
  - (a) to do so might incriminate the person or the person's spouse or civil partner of an offence; or
  - (b) the answer to the question concerned may be the subject of legal professional privilege or any other legal privilege.
- (2) However, a statement or admission made in so complying is not admissible in evidence against either of them in proceedings for any offence other than perjury.
- (3) For the avoidance of doubt, subsection (2) does not limit section 76G or the exercise of a power under any other statutory provision. **22**.



*Amendment of the Post Office Act 1993***10 Amendment of the Post Office Act 1993**

The *Post Office Act 1993* is amended in accordance with sections 11 and 12.

**11 Section 15 amended**

- (1) Section 15 (application of customs Acts) is amended as follows.
- (2) In subsection (2)(e) for “enactments” substitute “provisions”.
- (3) At the end add —
  - (7) In this section, “statutory provisions” includes —
    - (a) any Community instrument which applies as part of the law of the Island under section 2(1) of the *European Communities (Isle of Man) Act 1973*; and
    - (b) any Community instrument applied to the Island as part of the law of the Island under section 2A of that Act.
  - (8) In subsection (7) “Community instrument” has the same meaning as in section 1(1) of the *European Communities (Isle of Man) Act 1973*. ■

**12 Section 49 amended**

- (1) Section 49(3) (inviolability of mails) is amended as follows.
- (2) Omit “or” at the end of paragraph (a).
- (3) After paragraph (a) insert —
  - (aa) to the powers conferred by Part VA of the *Customs and Excise Management Act 1986* (importation and exportation of cash) in relation to cash contained in postal packets;
  - (ab) to the powers conferred by Chapter 3 of Part 1 of the *Proceeds of Crime Act 2008* (recovery of cash in summary proceedings) in relation to cash contained in postal packets; ■
- (4) At the end of paragraph (b) insert “or”.
- (5) At the beginning of paragraph (c) insert ■ to ■.

*Amendment of the Proceeds of Crime Act 2008***13 Amendment of the Proceeds of Crime Act 2008**

The *Proceeds of Crime Act 2008* is amended in accordance with sections 14 to 19.

**14 Section 43 amended**

- (1) Section 43 (searches) is amended as follows.
- (2) At the end of subsection (6)(e) insert —

After section 43 insert —

**6A 43A Searches: postal packets**

**16 Section 44 amended**

In section 44(1) (searches: prior approval), after “section 43” insert **66** or section 43A **62**.

**17 Section 45 amended**

- (1) Section 45 (searches: code of practice) is amended as follows.
- (2) After subsection (1) insert —
  - 66** (1A) The Department of Home Affairs, after consulting the Isle of Man Post Office, must make a code of practice in connection with the exercise of the powers conferred by section 43A and bring it into operation by order. **62**.
- (3) In subsection (3) for “the code” substitute “a code”.
- (4) In subsection (4) for “The code” substitute “A code”.
- (5) In the marginal note to section 45, for “code of practice” substitute **66** codes of practice **62**.

**18 Section 49 amended**

- (1) Section 49 (release of detained cash) is amended as follows.
- (2) In subsection (3) after “cash was seized” insert **66** or, in the case of cash contained in a postal packet, upon an application by the sender or the person to whom the packet is addressed **62**.
- (3) After subsection (4) add —
  - 66** (5) In subsection (3) “sender”, in relation to any postal packet, means the person whose communication it is. **62**.

**19 Section 54 amended**

- (1) Section 54 (compensation where no forfeiture order made) is amended as follows.
- (2) For subsection (1) substitute —
  - 66** (1) If no forfeiture order is made in respect of any cash detained under this Chapter —
    - (a) the person to whom the cash belongs;
    - (b) the person from whom the cash was seized; or
    - (c) in the case of cash contained in a postal packet, the sender or the person to whom the packet is addressed,may make an application to the High Bailiff for compensation. **62**.
- (3) After subsection (7) add —

- (8) In subsection (1) “sender”, in relation to any postal packet, means the person whose communication it is. ■.
